Joe Mays is an attorney with Bradley Arant Boult Cummings and a member of St. Mary's-on-the-Highlands and Christ Church in Fairfield. Joe serves as Chancellor of the Episcopal Diocese of Alabama, a member and secretary of the Metro YMCA Board of Directors, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Alabama Arthritis Foundation, and Chairman of the Alabama Educational Television Foundation Board. In 1997, Joe received the Walter P. Gewin Award from the Alabama State Bar for his contributions to Continuing Legal Education. Joe is a graduate of Tulane University (B.A.), Cornell University (M.A.), and the University of Alabama (J.D.).



Randy Sellers is an attorney with Starnes Atchison and a graduate of Vanderbilt University with a B.A. and a J.D. Randy and his wife, Darla, are actively involved at St. Luke's Episcopal Church where he has served on the Vestry and numerous committees, including Chairman of the Outreach Committee. He is involved with several outreach ministries, including prison ministry, and currently serves on the Board of an interfaith network dedicated to assisting temporarily homeless families. John "Kee" Sloan is Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Alabama. He was born in Vicksburg on November 13, 1955, son of Richard Crofton and Mary Elizabeth Sloan. He attended Mississippi State University, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1976. He received his Master of Divinity from The School of Theology at the University of the South in 1981. Bishop Sloan was elected to serve as bishop suffragan by the Diocese of Alabama at a special convention on September 30, 2007. Before his election, Bishop Sloan served for 14 years as rector of St. Thomas' Parish, Huntsville, Alabama. Sloan had previously served as chaplain to the University of Mississippi; rector of All Saints' Parish, Grenada; vicar of Incarnation Parish, West Point; and curate of Holy Cross, Olive Branch; all in Mississippi. Bishop Sloan assists Bishop Parsley in various duties including pastoral care of clergy, small church congregational development, college campus ministries and multicultural ministry programs; and implementation of Alabama's ACTS II Capital Campaign objectives. He visits parishes for baptisms and confirmations, and participates in councils of the church on the national and international levels. Bishop Sloan, known for his outreach to persons with disabilities and to the poor, is married to the former Tina Marie Brown. He and Tina are the parents of two children, McKee and Mary Nell.
